Think It Over: This section is about turning what God is saying to you into action steps. These talking points, questions, and scriptures are designed to help you take your own next step. If you are leading a group through this guide, don't feel like you have to answer every question. Pick out those questions that will stir up conversation and action among your group.

- What is one of your favorite children's Bible stories? What made it a favorite? Dave loved Noah's Ark, but when you think about what is going on, it actually isn't a nice bedtime story. Daniel and the Lion's Den is another one. We aren't suggesting that we don't tell children Bible stories, but how can we avoid allowing the kid's version of a Bible story lessen the impact of what is really going on? Take the time to read Esther 2:1-18 with the adult implications. What are those adult implications? What are we to do with them?
- ➤ Read the "God uses crooked sticks to make straight lines" section. Review the story of Samson and the two understandings that God does use crooked sticks to make straight lines. What is encouraging about that principle? What is concerning about it?
- Review the "Christ followers are living far from home in a world that is dangerous" section. Pick a couple of the passages and share what applications there are for your personal world. At first glance, the Jeremiah and Romans passages seem to be contradicting each other. What are Jeremiah and Paul trying to have us see? Which concept do you tend to lean towards at the expense of the other? Why do some people like black and white over messy and vice versa?
- Review the "God seems hidden, but He is not hiding" section. Any follow-up thoughts? (Remember, this was discussed in Esther: Part 1 on 1/23/22.)
- ➤ Think about Daniel's and Joseph's responses to their situations. Think about Esther in very similar situations. What do you think about the very different responses? Why is it easy to be an armchair quarterback and come down hard on Esther? How does that tendency show up in your life today? How do you navigate the tension between truth and grace?
