

**Think It Over:** This section is about turning what God is saying to you into action steps. These talking points, questions, and scriptures are designed to help you take your own next step. If you are leading a group through this guide, don't feel like you have to answer every question. Pick out those questions that will stir up conversation and action among your group.

- Where do you find yourself in option overload? Has option overload ever caused you just to settle or become paralyzed? How do you let the "outcome" drive your ability to choosing live well with options, really?
- Read Genesis 13:7-12. Describe what was going on. How does Lot use his option to choose? Why do you think Lot didn't anticipate where his option would lead him? How does that kind of situation unfold today? How have you seen the use of options end up taking life rather than giving life?
- Why do you think God gives the option to choose? Do you ever wish the option to choose was out of our hands? Explain your answer. Read Romans 14:5. What is the process to become fully convinced in your own mind that the option you are choosing is wise?
- Read Romans 14:8 MSG. What is the scope of our accountability to God? How does that make you feel? How should that make us live?
- Read 1 Corinthians 9:1-14 NIV with the mind-set of rights. What kind of rights did Paul have? What are some of the good reasons not to give up our rights? How are we to be gracious without becoming a doormat? Explain the balance between the two.
- Read 1 Corinthians 9:15-27. What are some of the reasons Paul is able to give up his rights? How do those reasons translate for us today? Which ones, out of the three given in the Message Guide, inspire you to let go your rights? Which reason might be the hardest to get your mind and heart around?

**Next Steps:** We have the option to choose, so we must be wise. What steps can you take this week to integrate the concept that "freedom of options is not freedom from outcomes." What consequences do you want to avoid and which ones do you want to embrace?
