

Think It Over: This section is about turning what God is saying to you into action steps. These talking points, questions, and scriptures are designed to help you take your own next step. If you are leading a group through this guide, don't feel like you have to answer every question. Pick out those questions that will stir up conversation and action among your group.

- Why do kids love to play follow the leader? What does playing follow the leader teach kids? Why does it begin to lose its appeal? What keeps it exciting for kids? Do teenagers and adults usually like to play follow the leader? Where did your answer come from? Why does it become harder to follow leader? What is needed for a leader to be followed? How does that translate to a Christ-follower's relationship with God?
- Read 1 Samuel 13:1-15. Review the ➤ *You can't follow Christ without the challenge of trials* section. Where do you find yourself in relationship to the challenge of a trial? If you are facing a trail, how would characterize it? What are the ways a person can prepare and brace for one? Have you ever been a stench for the right reasons to someone? What happened? Why is it a challenge to be one? How could others support and strengthen you?
- Review the ➤ *You can't follow Christ without being confronted with the temptation to give up* section. When was the last time you were confronted with the temptation to give up? Why was that? Which one of the "can be" descriptions are you dealing with most right now? What do you need to do to strengthen your resolve? Are you willing to pay the price to do that? Who could support you?
- Review the ➤ *You can't follow Christ by ignoring His directions* section. What direction are you clearly ignoring? Why is it so easy to see what Saul was ignoring, but so much harder to see when it comes to what we as Christ-followers ignore? What are some of the ways we justify ignoring? Are you identifying the consequences of ignoring? How long will it take and what will you have to lose to start over? Read Proverbs 24:16-20 TPT. Have you given up?

Next Steps: Look at the Bottom Line. How have you used following Jesus to get your own way? What has to happen for it to become more and more about His way than your way? Can you imagine what life would look like if you loved playing follow the leader with Jesus? What is stopping you?
