Think It Over: This section is about turning what God is saying to you into action steps. These talking points, questions, and scriptures are designed to help you take your own next step. If you are leading a group through this guide, don't feel like you have to answer every question. Pick out those questions that will stir up conversation and action among your group.

- When was the last time you asked yourself, "What are my options in the area of _____?" What were the circumstances? How easy was it for you to come to an answer? Are there any times when you have not been able to come to an answer? Why is it important to come to terms with what Christ follower means when answering this question? How do the five areas of options play into answer the question?
- Read 2 Timothy 3:16-17 NCV. Have you come to agree that Christ followers are to go to the Bible and then go with the Bible? What interferes with completely embracing that truth? What do you think needs to happen for a person to embrace it? Read Romans 14:13 MSG. How does this fit with the question especially when thinking about others (remember the 5 areas of options)?
- Read through each of the points and the passages for the Matrix. Do you believe the process can help a person draw a reasonable answer to the question? Why or why not? How does Wisdom Personal speak to your own expression of options? How does it make you feel when a person has options that you don't and vice versa? What does Romans 14:1 MSG have to say?
- Review 1 Corinthians 10:27-30 NLT. What role does the Witness Effect concept play in the way you practice permissible options? How far should you take Witness - Effect? What about other believers who want to superimpose their option or lack of option on another? How can you handle that as Paul would?

<u>Next Steps</u>: Walk through the Matrix answering "Is it ok for a Christ follower to watch a PG 13 or Rated R movie?" What are your answers for others and yourself? How will your answer affect the way you live and the way you look at other Christ followers?


