

Think It Over: This section is about turning what God is saying to you into action steps. These talking points, questions, and scriptures are designed to help you take your own next step. If you are leading a group through this guide, don't feel like you have to answer every question. Pick out those questions that will stir up conversation and action among your group.

- Have you ever seen someone caught up with the adrenaline of a game? Have you ever been caught up with a game? What happened? When did it cross the line from fun to an obsession? When have you seen that same process played out with something other than a game? Why can options be so wonderful and yet so dangerous?
- What were your thoughts and/or beliefs regarding gambling before you heard Sunday's message, *Feeling Lucky*? Where did they originate from? What does the Bible actually say about gambling?
- Read through the "Keep your day job!" section in your Message Guide. What are your views on work? Can you think of any other Biblical themes regarding work? What should gambling never become in light of these Biblical principles?
- Read through the "Keep your budget." section in your Message Guide. How seriously do you take the resources God has given you to steward and leverage? What is your response to the 10-10-80 plan? How could you integrate that into your financial life? What would the implications be? (Or if you already are, what have the results been?) What might you have to scale back or give up to genuinely practice tithing and saving? Do you believe God would bless you for it? How would life look with those blessings?

Next Steps: When it comes to gambling, gaming, etc., how are you interacting with the concepts of Wisdom, Witness, Weakness, and Woe? Describe what you really would need to do to integrate these 4 W's into the way you live as a Christ follower?

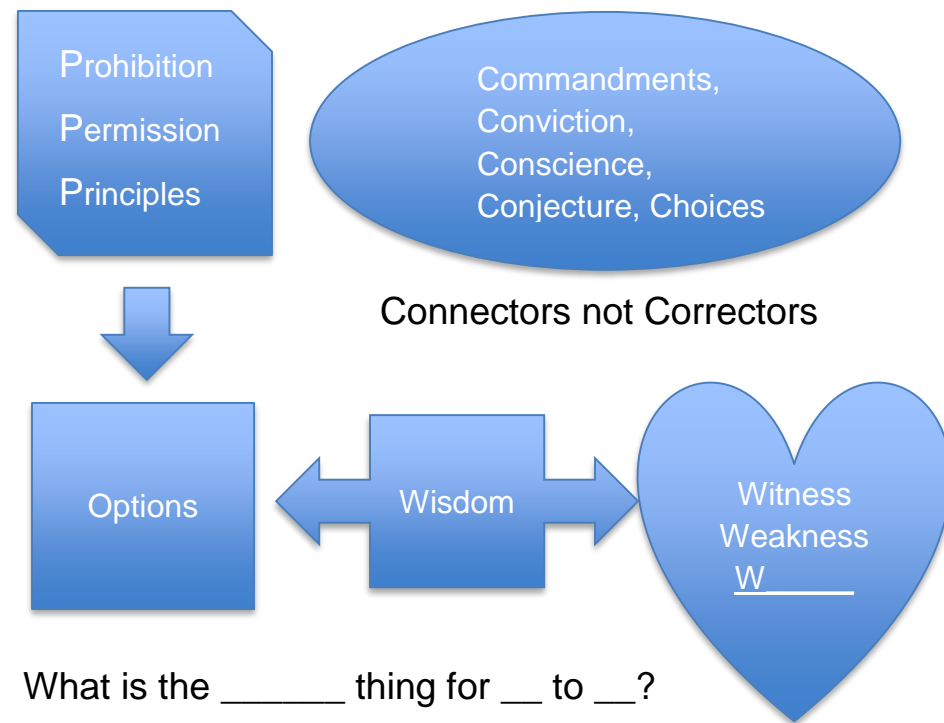

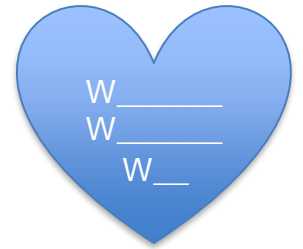
