Think It Over: This section is about turning what God is saying to you into action steps. These talking points, questions, and scriptures are designed to help you take your own next step. If you are leading a group through this guide, don't feel like you have to answer every question. Pick out those questions that will stir up conversation and action among your group.

- What are some typical expectations going into a marriage or relationship that most have found to be unrealistic to meet? Have you had any of them? What happened?
- ➤ Talk about a time when you used one or more of the 4 Cs—convince, convict, control, coerce—to try to fulfill your expectations in a relationship.
- When you run into conflict in a relationship, is your tendency to win, compromise, stuff, or leave? How has that worked in the past?
- Read Ephesians 5:21-33 MSG. What stands out to you about this passage? What can we learn in this passage about mutual submission? How is Christ our greatest model of submission?
- Why do you think mutual submission is so difficult for most couples and relationships (church life)? Do you think marriages/relationships are about compromise? Why or why not?
- Review the Submission Competition section and discuss. How possible is it to really have the mind of Christ? What does a person need to do to hold on to it? How can a Community Group help?
- Read Ephesians 5:1–2. Does the idea of "giving yourself up" to another person - with the mindset of Christ - seem reasonable? Why or why not?

Next Steps: What does your spouse (or future spouse) or any relationship owe you? Nothing. Healthy relationships operate with the mind of Christ. We take our cue from Jesus' all-encompassing command: "As I have loved you, you are to love one another" (John 13:34). What will you specifically do to take on more of the mind of Christ?


