Think It Over: This section is about turning what God is saying to you into action steps. These talking points, questions, and scriptures are designed to help you take your own next step. If you are leading a group through this guide, don't feel like you have to answer every question. Pick out those questions that will stir up conversation and action among your group.


- What are some things that just plain make you happy? What does our culture say you need to be happy? How much of your day do you spend seeking out things that make you happy?
- ➤ If Jesus Never Said, "Go do what makes you happy," what does He actually say and what does He do?
- Read Proverbs 14:2. Think of a time you did something wrong or unwise in pursuit of happiness. Are you currently being tempted to do something wrong or unwise?
- What are some mini-gods in your life—stuff, perfection, having your way, control, feeling good? What is the scariest part about replacing the pursuit of happiness with the pursuit of God? What are some of the things in your life you think you should value higher than happiness?
- Read Psalm 37:1-7. Think about how you delight in the Lord. How have you experienced the blessings of God even when life isn't going the way you want?
- Extra Credit: How does one or more of the following Scriptures speak into the concept of happiness? Psalm 1:1-6; Ecclesiastes 7:14; John 16:33; Matthew 5:3-10; James 1:1-3; Proverbs 16:20.

Next Steps: Are you counting on something in the future like a job, spouse, house, or education to make life better? What step will you take this week to put your hope in Christ instead? Choose 1-2 things that you've been putting in front of God and skip them for a week. Replace them with time with God. As a Community Group, how can we model to each other what it looks like to delight in God instead of just pursuing happiness?

The <u>Culture</u> of Happiness

- ⇒ Whatever makes me <u>happy</u> must be <u>right</u>.
 Whatever makes me <u>unhappy</u> must be <u>wrong</u>.
- Discomfort, <u>delay</u>, risk, <u>suffering</u>, inconveniences, and <u>obstacles</u> can't be God's will.
- ➡ Without knowing it, I begin to worship the false gods of comfort, money, pleasure, and things.

Jesus <u>Doesn't</u> Want You <u>Happy</u>...

²As we run, we must always look towards Jesus. He is the one who trusted God completely. Our faith starts with him, and he will help us to trust God all the way to the end. Jesus accepted punishment on the cross. He chose to receive much pain. He did not think about being ashamed to die like that. He knew that God had prepared something very good for him that would make him happy...

The World's Formula

Better possessions + peaceful circumstances

- + thrilling experiences + the right relationships
 - + the perfect appearance = happiness

¹⁵Don't love the world's ways. Don't love the world's goods. Love of the world squeezes out love for the Father. ¹⁶Practically everything that goes on in the world—wanting your own way, wanting everything for yourself, wanting to appear important—has nothing to do with the Father. It just isolates you from him. ¹⁷The world and all its wanting, wanting is on the way out—but whoever does what God wants is set for eternity.

Jesus Wants You
